For 23 years we have been dedicated to placing a spotlight on issues that are often difficult to discuss as a community. We have been successful in highlighting the need for equity, unity and justice for all people and our precious Earth through performance and community activism. Each year we donate 10% of proceeds from our Spring Concert to a West Michigan organization fighting for social justice. In our 21<sup>st</sup> season we donated to the Michigan Human Trafficking Task Force, performed at the Temple Emmanuel's Holocaust Remembrance Service and took part in many community centered activities including volunteering at Gilda's Club and marching to support black lives after the horror in Charlottesville.

We also had an exciting event last summer. GRWC was chosen to host the Sister Singers Network (SSN) quadrennial festival here in Grand Rapids. We welcomed women's choruses from around the country to participate in 4 days of workshops, performances by special guests, performances from each chorus and "mass choruses" where singers from many choruses learned the same music and came together to sing in a large group. We were thrilled to sponsor this festival and to welcome so many visitors to Grand Rapids.
